I am so proud of what we accomplished in 2021 in the face of the continuing pandemic.


Faced with another year of schools being closed because of the pandemic, we teamed up with two other NGO's, SERNiña and Las Manos de Christine, to rent a small house. Now dubbed the El Hato Community Center, it serves as the hub for our programs.

We also teamed up with Las Manos de Christine to deliver almost-daily tutoring to primary school students. Our schedule filled up quickly and stayed full the entire year. The program's positive impact has been clear. No words can describe how proud we feel when we hear the appreciation expressed by the El Hato moms.

In 2020, Finca Azotea notified us that they needed the space occupied by the Garden of Hope. After considering many options, we realized that we already had the best option: the El Hato Community Center. Moving was not easy, but thanks to the many generous donations we received, we successfully moved to El Hato. We look forward to extending our gardening program to the El Hato community in 2022.

In 2021, Sonya Waldthausen was no longer able to serve as executive director in Guatemala. Fortunately, we found a great replacement in David Santa Catalina. With the ongoing pandemic and garden move, David couldn't have taken over at a more difficult time, but has provided energetic and dynamic leadership. 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OUR STORY

Together We Can Guatemala (TWCG) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit registered in Pennsylvania, USA. Asociación Juntos Podemos (AJP) is a nonprofit association registered in Guatemala. Both were founded in 2018 to provide financial, programmatic and administrative oversight to two principal projects: The Garden of Hope Permaculture Center and the El Hato Literacy Center. We continue to accomplish our organizational mission and vision by supporting these projects.



Garden of Hope

The Garden of Hope Permaculture Center began in 2015 as a community garden, accessible to families in Jocotenango, with the mission to provide a safe green space to connect with nature, foster, joy, and develop life skills.

El Hato Literacy Center

The El Hato Literacy Center originated in 2012 as a project of the nonprofit Las Manos de Christine to address the needs of first-generation readers in El Hato.



GARDEN OF HOPE

Goal 1: Increase environmental stewardship, improve nutrition, and improve key life skills of students through school garden programs

Goal 2: Community-building: Provide a communal green space for the families of El Hato and opportunities for them to learn and share local plant and food knowledge



Garden to kitchen: This amazing program allowed us to share with locals tasty and nutritious vegan recipes. Every session a new recipe was introduced and prepared by the participants, and everyone took home the result of their effort to share with their families.

Community days: Our community days have been an extraordinary way to get involved with the community by sharing time together and enjoying wonderful, nutritious and organic snacks to share.

Vacation camp: Our vacation camp this year was full of fun. Participants enjoyed and learned about medicinal plants, the environment and gardening. When word of the fun got out, more children arrived!

LOOKING AT THE FUTURE

The potential of our Garden of Hope project is enormous and with only few months in our new location we have already made a wonderful impact in El Hato.

This upcoming year we will increase our reach and impact in the community by implementing more garden programs and by increasing production and local involvement in the process.

In order to ensure stability and allow growth we will hire a new Garden Coordinator and a Garden Assistant. We will also keep seeking new grants and partnerships and reinforce our impact measurement.

We are looking forward to achieving so much in 2022. Our team is really motivated and committed, and we are ready to get to work!



LITERACY CENTER

Goal 1: Improve academic performance and graduation rates of primary school students at El Hato.

Goal 2: Improve literacy, critical thinking, and appreciation for reading among primary school students.

Goal 3: Provide access to resources for parents to improve literacy and computer skills.



In 2021, with the El Hato public school closed the entire year, we directed all our efforts to our tutoring program. Primary school students in El Hato's public school received very limited instruction time from their regular teachers, but each participant in our program received up to 147 additional hours of in-person instruction, resulting in all of them passing their grade. The incredible work of our Library Coordinator Adriana Chacón and by Nicole Shoc (of our partner Las Manos de Christine) resulted in extraordinary support for the children of El Hato and their families.

LOOKING AT THE FUTURE

2021 proved that the support provided by our tutoring program during these challenging days is critical to the families in El Hato.

In 2022 we will give maximum priority to the implementation of the tutoring program. We are going to develop a new tracking tool to individually assess our beneficiaries and improve our approach to gathering qualitative data.

We will strengthen our relationship with the primary school and the parents, and we will continue our work seeking grants that would financially support our Literacy Center.

In 2022 we want to make our program replicable so that, when the opportunity arises, we will be ready to help other towns in need by providing a complete, stable and strong program.




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
